





Networking

National Recycling Coalition

Annual Recycling Conference

In 2009, CAFR hosted the 20th annual Colorado Summit for Recycling—Colorado's only statewide recycling conference. The Summit offers technical training workshops, general recycling sessions and an excellent peer-networking opportunity.

Annual Meeting

Publications

This nationwide event promotes recycling and buying recycled products. To help celebrate America Recycles Day, CAFR publishes a recycling calendar that highlights the student winners of the annual statewide recycling poster contest.

Policy Committee

The committee tracks and promotes items of importance to the recycling community, educates legislators and decision makers, and works with other organizations to ensure that the voice of recycling is heard in Colorado.

Education and Outreach

One of CAFR's goals is to maximize our exposure. This includes reaching out to other businesses and institutions in the community and promoting the activities and accomplishments of CAFR and its members. We focus on the professional production of quality organic products, developing markets for those products and educating our customers in their proper use and application.
