Compost Regulation Revision





Proposed Changes

CESQ

 Increase onsite and in-process volume of Type 2 feedstocks (manure, animal materials, source separated organics) from 5/10 cy to 20 cy

Class I

- Add facility that can accept up to 5,000 cy of Type 1 feedstock and food residuals/food processing vegetative waste.
- Allow for on-farm composting of materials generated onsite along with Type 1 feedstock and food residuals/food processing vegetative waste - up to 5,000 cy and under 2 acres.

May: Finalize Draft

June: Internal Review

Feb: Present to Solid and Hazardous Waste Commission

SB23-191: Organics Diversion Study

- Evaluate/recommend diversion policies
- Educational resources

- Colorado specific diversion impacts






Estimated timeline

Open RFP

Issue a Request for Proposals shortly after SB23-191 goes into effect.

Stakeholder Process

Hold stakeholder meetings to discuss findings and develop policy recommendations.







SB23-253: Compostable products labeling standards





Key elements

- Creates standards for producers of products sold or distributed in Colorado that are represented as compostable
 - Certified compostable
 - Says compostable
 - Green labeling or other easily identifiable markings
- Prohibits non-compostables from misleading labeling
 - Enforced through complains to CDPHE, which will be verified and referred to AG's office appropriate
- Public outreach campaign





Estimated timeline

January 1, 2024

- Misleading labeling rules active
- Proof of compliance
- Forum for complaints will open (complaint hotline)
- Public outreach will begin

July 1, 2024

- Compostable products requirements begin
 - ASTM certification, labeling, etc.

STAR+ Program Compost Incentivized Use

This request is still in development

STAR/STAR+ (Saving Tomorrow's Agricultural Resources) is a program utilizing grant funding to encourage the adoption of soil health practices

Asking FRWD/RREO for funding over 3 years (\$50k/\$75k/\$100k)

Would incentivize compost use on STAR/STAR+ farms located in front range conservation districts

Funds would be routed through conservation districts, under CSA's Soil Health Program





CDPHE Waste Diversion Grants





RREO

Grants

- Over \$2,000,000 available annually
- Infrastructure grant is open in the fall/winter for projects over \$30K
- Mini grant is open in the spring for projects \$10k-\$30k

NextCycle Colorado

 Business incubator to help get waste prevention and diversion projects off the ground





FRWD

Grants

- 3-4 grant cycles per year, many of which allow or are directly aimed at organics
- \$15,000,000+ per year when fully funded
- Looking for large projects (greater than 1,000 tons/yr)

Technical Assistance Service Provider (TASP)

- Provides direct support to front range communities to help with increasing diversion
- Workshops, consulting, policy development, planning, and more are available at no cost
