She holds a Bachelor of Science in Social Work from the University of North Dakota and a Masters of Applied Science in Environmental Policy from the University of Denver.

Chapman has served as Recycle Colorado's Executive Director since June of 2022. During her tenure, Chapman has served as the Chair of the Colorado Producer Responsibility Advisory Board and overseen the passage of legislation to improve composting, increase battery recycling, and streamline funding programs to invest in recycling programs and end market development.
