Poster Contest Rules

Please read the following contest rules carefully. Only posters that meet the contest rules will be considered.



Deadline

Poster files and release forms should be received by Recycle Colorado **no later than April 29, 2022**. Please submit entries early. You will receive a confirmation that your poster has been received once you do submit. Winners will be notified as soon as possible after the deadline.

Eligibility

All students (kindergarten through high school) in Colorado public and private schools (including home schools) and youth organizations are eligible.

Poster Requirements

Posters created by students must be their own original artwork. Copyrighted characters (such as Superman) or copyrighted clip art will not be accepted.

- <u>Materials:</u> Students may use a variety of media, such as watercolor, pen and ink, crayon, markers, or computer graphics. Brighter colors show up better, light pencil marks will not show up. Artwork should be easy to see, read and understand. Students are encouraged to incorporate recycled or recyclable materials in their creations.
- Layout: Landscape (horizontal) layout is best, but portrait (vertical) layout will be accepted.
- <u>Release Form:</u><u>Each poster must be accompanied by a completed Release Form (See Page</u>6). A poster not accompanied by a completed Release Form will not be eligible for further judging.
- <u>Submission</u>: **Only electronic submissions are accepted** (scanned copies or photos of hand-drawn posters). The preferred format is JPEG, PNG or PDF. The electronic submission should capture the original poster without editing, and images should be clear (not blurry) and well-lit.

Theme

Students are encouraged to incorporate the theme "<u>The Journey of Recycling</u>" into their artwork (see theme explanation on page 4).

Judging Procedure

The posters will be grouped into one of the following five grade categories:

- Kindergarten through 2nd grade
- 3rd through 4th grade
- 5th through 6th grade
- 7th through 8th grade
- 9th through 12th grade

The best poster from each grade category will be selected based on the judging criteria listed below. One finalist will be awarded in each grade category.

Judging Criteria

- 1. Conveys clear message through text and artwork. (25 points)
- 2. Exhibits creativity, originality and artistic quality. (25 points)
- 3. Displays visual clarity and correct spelling easy to read and understand. (25 points)
- 4. Addresses the theme listed on page 4. (25 points)

Prizes

For every Poster Contest Participant:

Teachers/Schools/Organizations, please photocopy and give a "Certificate of Recognition" (found on page 7) to all students that participate to acknowledge their efforts.

Poster Contest Winners & Their Teachers/Classrooms/Schools:

One winner from each student's grade category will be awarded a \$100 gift card for themselves. Additionally, each classroom/teacher/school of the winners from the five grade categories will be awarded a \$100 gift card for room supplies.

The winners' artwork will be highlighted on Recycle Colorado's website and used to promote recycling and Colorado Recycles Week, celebrated the third week in November.

Theme for 2022 The Journey of Recycling



Recycling is the process of collecting and processing materials that would otherwise be thrown away as trash and turning them into NEW products. The journey is long, but it benefits your community, the environment, and your future!

Step 1: Collection

There are several methods for collecting recyclables, including curbside collection, drop-off centers, and deposit or refund programs.

Step 2: Processing

After collection, recyclables are sent to a recovery facility to be sorted by material type. The sorted recyclables are then sent to different processing facilities where they are cleaned so they can be used to make new things. Recyclables are bought and sold just like the things you buy in the store.

Step 3: Make NEW Products out of the RECYCLED Items

Once recycled items have been processed, the company who bought the items turns them into something NEW! Some examples of this are using plastic bottles to make shirts and shoes or aluminum cans to make bikes. There are also many companies that recycle beverage containers back into beverage containers so they don't have to make new ones.

Recycling is helping to provide the materials we need to build our future. We need you to help paint the picture of the journey that our recycled items go on! Show us how recycled materials like aluminum, glass, and plastic can be made into new products. Resources to help you learn more can be found below.

Just like any other system, success depends on many small actions and those actions all add up! Please, recycle with care and help reduce waste. It's always best to consult your local government or service provider for the best information about what is recyclable in your community.

Talking Points for Teachers on Recycling

Did you know that recycling is different in every city, county and state. What do you know about recycling in your community?

- To learn more, you can look up recycling in your city or county to see what kind of recycling is provided and what materials are collected.
 - Do you have a drop off location or does a truck or hauler come to collect your recycling?
 - If you live in a multifamily home (apartment, condo, townhouse), do you have a recycling bin or where do you bring your recyclables?
 - What color is your recycling bin?
 - Which plastics can you recycle in your community?
 - Can you name 3 other items that you can recycle in your community?

Have you ever wondered what happens to your recyclables once the truck picks them up?

- Where do you think they go?
