Description: EPA Region 8 is kicking off a new initiative to "spread the word" about Pay As You Throw (PAYT) across Colorado. These incentive-based rates are in place all over the nation - including some notables here in Colorado (Boulder, Fort Collins, Lafayette, among others). However, despite extremely strong performance and acceptance in communities, there are not very many programs in Colorado. EPA Region 8 thinks it can grow, and that PAYT can be a linchpin in moving Colorado's diversion out of the near-basement Biocycle's numbers place us in.

Pitkin County Solid Waste Center - The Pitkin County facility is a municipally owned Solid Waste Center (SWC). Through innovative waste-reduction programs, the Pitkin SWC has achieved a diversion rate of 50%. The tour highlights all of the center's solid waste programs: composting, aggregate recovery, household hazardous waste and electronic waste, scrap metal, salvage and conventional recycling programs.

Doerr Hosier Conference Center - Architect Jeffrey Berkus will lead the tour of the Aspen Institute's Goldcertified LEED Green Building. The tour highlights the components that helped the building earn a LEED Gold rating and other green elements of the resort and conference center.
